TEAMS (Tests of Engineering Aptitude, Mathematics and Science) is a popular annual competition, coordinated by JETS (Junior Engineering Technical Society) —the national organization promoting engineering and technology to America's youth—that challenges high school students (grades 9-12) in ways no other program does by introducing them to the practical applications of math and science. When students compete in TEAMS they learn the answer to that age-old question, “**When will I ever use this?**” and discover the opportunities that await them in the engineering profession.

Each year students become part of the action as they work together and answer questions about everyday real-world challenges. **What will they tackle in TEAMS 2010?** The critical and global need of providing access to one of nature's most vital resources on earth: **clean water**. Coach a team and watch your students learn first-hand how they can become part of the solution to end this crisis.

The competition at University of Kentucky will take place on March 6, 2010. Register your team online at www.jets.org/teams and submit payment directly to JETS.
