Ambassador Program

The College of Engineering Ambassador Program is comprised of two highly select groups of engineering students dedicated to the promotion of the College of Engineering (COE) and the University of Kentucky. Student Ambassadors assist COE faculty and staff with recruitment events, answer prospective student questions, and highlight all the amazing opportunities available at UK and in the COE. Outreach Ambassadors, on the other hand, primarily work with elementary, middle, and high school students in their schools to raise awareness of engineering and to engage the students in hands-on activities.

Qualifications:

- Minimum 3.0 cumulative GPA and 3.0 GPA in most recent semester
- Outgoing and enthusiastic student enrolled in the COE
- Confident attitude with ability to communicate effectively individually or to a group
- Goal-oriented, reliable, proven leadership, and strong time management skills
- *Outreach Ambassadors: reliable transportation*

Compensation:

Compensation for this role is a \$600 annual stipend. The funds will be awarded as \$300 in the fall semester and \$300 in the spring semester. If an Engineering Ambassador is also selected as an Engineering LLP Peer Mentor, the annual stipend will increase to \$1,000 annually. Peer Mentor responsibilities are defined in a separate job description provided by the Director of Special Programs for the College of Engineering.

Authority:

Any questions or concerns pertaining to the College of Engineering Ambassador Program will be channeled through the Director of Recruitment and/or the Associate Dean of Academic Affairs. Outreach Ambassadors specifically report to the PLTW Director in the College of Engineering. The Director of Recruitment, Associate Dean of Academic Affairs, or the PLTW Director may remove an Engineering Ambassador from their position at any time for not meeting agreed upon requirements or due to conduct detrimental to the program.
