

SENIOR DESIGN PRESENTATION (ECE DAY)

Every semester, senior design presentations are carried out on ECE day, which typically falls on the Friday of dead week. It is during this day, 25% of your final grade will be determined, so be prepared to give your best presentation. In addition to your grades, you will also be competing with other groups to win prizes or awards. Thus, to help you get started for the big day, here's a list of things you can do.

1. Prepare poster boards

A well organized poster board will provide a good insight to audiences on what the senior design project is all about. In general, we can perceive a poster board as a summarized version of your final report. Here's some important information which you should include in your posters:

- Title of project
- Members' names
- Abstract
- Some technical description
- Graphics are encouraged, e.g., block diagrams, pictures, graphs, etc
- Budget list

Note: The poster boards can be of any size, depending on your preferences or needs. Please use clear fonts and bigger font size for easier viewing. Colorful graphics are more noticeable.

2. Make sure you have all the equipments you need

Before ECE day, make a checklist of equipments you might need during the presentation. If there are some apparatus you might want us to provide, please let us know before hand.

3. Double check your design project and give yourself ample time to setup

Not to sound pessimistic, but there is always a chance of the project not working on the presentation day. To avoid this, you should always try to setup your project at the common area as soon as possible, so that you will have plenty of time to debug any unforeseen problem which might occur and have time for more pizza! The project setup can be done at noon.

4. Prepare what to say

Last but not least, try to understand every aspect of the project well so that you will be able to explain and answer questions from the judges or audience. Prepare what you want to say prior to the presentation so that things will be more organized. Discuss with your group members who should go first and who will go next to avoid confusion. GOOD LUCK!!!
